Naipaul treatment of education in his novels reflects the themes of identity, power and social change into the complexities of education experiences in postcolonial context.

The novel portrays both the warmth and the conflicts within family units as well as theimpact of society pressures on individuals lives. Mr. Biswas struggles to get freedom from the Tulsi family. He impulsively marriage into tulsi family was orthodox Hindus. The status of Tulsi woman depends largely on their marriage, this is why Mrs. Tulsi is willing to marry her daughter to men of whatever occupation and disposition. He is hindu, holds part time job as asign painter.

Tulsi family was traditional joint family. Hanuman house is the only joint family in the society. Mr Biswas thinks after the marriage, he will get the Hanuman house. But the house was controlled by Tulsi. In tulsi family woman

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controls the family and take decisions. They not giving importance to men, same to Mr.Biswas also. So he goes to a rent house and faced lot of struggle. Still got freedom from the Hanuman house. He is happy with his wife shama but, financially not. He accept the situation and take a decision to buy a new house.

He need identity in the society. So, Mr. Biswas's lifelong opession with the words andlanguage came in hand. He always through language is beautiful itself. He spent much time with novels because to escape from the hard reality from the life and hardship. He becomes a sign painter because he loves the shapes of letters and a journalist and he loves reading the newspapers. In Naipaul novel the characters, cultural and heritage often express through the use of language. In *A house for Mr. Biswas* language becomes a maker of social status, ethnic identity and cultural affiliation. Mr. Biswas failed repeatedly. He could not match his friend formulaic stories about impoverished people's failure to escape their condition. He finish his own formulaic stories about his unhappy marriage after he splurged on a typewriter in port of Spain.

Mr. Biswas love for language led him to the writer profession. He never allowed

himself to write words as art or produce the kind of literature that he had always admire. Overall education in Naipaul novel explore the themes of identity, power and cultural and dynamics. His attention to linguistic details contribute to the depth of his story telling. The Tulsi family woman's holds the power within the Hanuman house not in society. This is because of the ungaind educational status of women.

In Naipau's work, A house for Mr. Biswas, food is a central aspects of the characters in daily lives. Naipaul describes the traditional cooking in island and the Indian dishes in island. In island the people cooks the different types of dishes in the own traditional cultural. Some Indian people lives in island, they not get the Indian dishes and never find the traditional food.
